



# Hog Heaven Shooting Event Info

## 1 FACILITY

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The Agreement only includes the Facility. The Facility address is 24905 RR12 Dripping Springs, TX 78620. Questions can be directed to the Range Officer, Rick Bangs – 512.944.6089.

## 2 RENTALS & CATERING

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- a. Hog Heaven does NOT provide catering or any rentals. You will be responsible for choosing, scheduling and paying for catering. Hog Heaven has 19 picnic tables that are available to use at no charge. If your event requires more sophisticated tables/chairs, we also have 12 round tables that can seat up to 10 persons each, as well as 120 chairs. If your event requires more tables, you will be responsible for choosing the vendor, scheduling delivery, arranging set-up, pick-up and payment. You will be responsible for providing all linens. We recommend Whim Event Rentals in Dripping Springs - 512-894-4555.
- b. Port-a-Potty - If your event utilizes the Sporting Clay course, we require that you have one port-a-potty brought out for the event. We require that you use Leinneweber Services – 512-847-9511. Please call them to schedule delivery, set-up, pickup and payment.
- c. Carts - Some of the course can be long and you may want to have carts brought in for shooters to rent. This will be your responsibility. Participants may bring their own carts. No Automobiles or Trucks will be Allowed on the Shooting Range.

## 3 SUPPLIES

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We ask everyone using the shooting range to bring a few specific items to help maintain the inventory. We are very specific about the brand required. This insures everyone using the shooting range gets the same quality products.

They are as follows (Quantities cover an event up to 75 people):

- a. Charmin toilet paper (12 roll-red package "Ultra Strong" at HEB)
- b. Liquid Hand Soap for Bathrooms (2)
- c. Brawny or Bounty Paper Towels (2 large rolls)

- d. Water. Its recommended that you supply enough water for your event to have water at a minimum of every other station on the course.

## 4 CLEANING

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We ask that the Clubhouse and Pavilion be returned to the same condition as before the event. This includes clearing all trash and decorations. You are also responsible for disposing of all left-over food. Please do not leave food in our refrigerators.

## 5 Course Set Up, Squadding & Rotation

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- a. Most all sporting Clays shoots will be done in one flight or rotation unless arrangements are made with shoot management. At this time the range is limited to do up to 192 shooters on two 12 station courses in one rotation with an A & B Team or Squad starting at each station. Each squad being comprise of 4 shooters.
- b. We can however go above 192 shooters but would have to be done in 2 flights or rotations.
- c. Unless otherwise cleared with Rick, each event will be 100 targets. Side games can also be set up.
- d. Course Setup:
  - A. 20 Station Course – 10 Stations w/3pairs and 10 Stations w/2pairs. 2 – 4-man teams each station allows 160 shooters in 1 rotation
  - B. 18 Station Course – 10 Stations w/3pairs, 6 Stations w/2pairs & 2 Stations w/4pairs. 2 – 4-man teams each station allows 144 shooters in 1 rotation
  - C. 16 Station Course – 15 Stations w/3pairs and 1 Station w/5pairs  
2-4-man teams each station allows 128 shooters in 1rotation
  - D. 15 Station Course – 5 Stations w/4pairs and 10 Stations w/3pairs. 2 – 4-man teams each station allows 120 shooters in 1 rotation
  - E. 13 Station Course – 11 Stations w/4pairs and 2 Stations w/3pairs. 2-4man teams each station allows 104 shooters in 1 rotation
  - F. 12 Station Course – 10 Stations w/4pairs and 2 Stations w/5pairs. 2-4-man teams each station allows 96 shooters in 1 rotation
  - G. 10 Station Course – 10 Stations w/5pairs. 2-4-man teams each station allows 80 shooters in 1 rotatio
  - H. 2 Courses -
    - 2 – 10 Station Course: Each having 5 Pairs at each station
    - 2 – 4-man teams at each station would allow 160 shooters in one rotation
    - 2 – 12 Station Courses: Each having 10 stations w/4pair and 2 stations w/5pair
    - 2 – 4-man teams at each station would allow 192 shooters in 1 rotation
    - 2 – 15 Station Courses: Each having 5 Stations w/4pairs and 10 Stations w/3pair
    - 2 – 4-man teams at each station would allow 240 shooters in 1 rotation

## 6 Cost

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- I. Target Cost per target, per shooter is \$0.43, So for a 100-target event, the cost will be \$43/shooter for targets.
- J. Set-up/management fee: 1-15 shooters - \$300; 16-25 shooters - \$400; 26-40 shooters - \$500; 41-60 shooters - \$600; 61-75 shooters - \$900; 75-125 - \$1,500; above 125 - \$2500. (This fee will be paid directly to Dripping Springs Shooting Team Boosters Inc.) If you are reserving the range for 192 shooters and only have

100 show up, you will still be charged the range fee based on the 192. We have to prepare ahead for the number you expect to have.

- K. Facility Use Fee up to 100 shooters - \$500.00, Over 100 shooters - \$650.00
- L. We will need a copy of the charities sales tax exempt certificate with number on it, so we won't have to charge sales tax.
- M. When valuable prizes are being offered, we strongly recommend having shooting team supplied puller-scorers (1 per station). If this is the case, there would be an additional \$100.00 for each puller/scorer for 1 rotation, \$175.00 for 2 rotations.
- N. Flurry will cost \$15.00 per two-man team (30 Targets). We suggest charging competitors \$25 or \$30 per team for a profit of \$10 or \$15. A flurry requires an experienced judge which can be supplied by Rick. Please let us know in advance if a flurry will be shot so we can arrange for the judge.

## 7 Shooting Range Safety Rules

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1. No loaded firearm may be brought onto the property for an organized shoot. This includes concealed carry. Your firearm must be brought to event unloaded.
  2. All firearms should have the action open at all times until you are instructed to load them by the Range Officer.
  3. Everyone entering the property must sign two waivers. One general property waiver and one shooting waiver.
  4. Everyone must have eye and ear protection and have it on when they enter the range area. (You are responsible for your own)
  5. Every shooter will be responsible for bringing their own shells. Only #7 ½, #8 or #9 shot will be allowed on the shotgun fields.
  6. Please alert competitors and observers that proper footwear is a must. They will be walking in areas with potentially tall grass. No sandals or flip-flops.
  7. Every shooter must have a shell bag or shell vest when shooting on any shotgun field.
  8. Everyone is responsible for picking up hulls when they are done shooting.
  9. No alcohol is to be consumed before or during shooting. If you have an event where alcohol will be served every shooter must be given a wristband before shoot begins. If that person is served alcohol, the wristband is to be cut off so that the Range Officers know that person is no longer shooting.
  10. If your event is a youth shooting event (i.e. 4H, FFA, YESS, SCTP, etc.) there will be no alcohol brought to, sold, given away or consumed on or nearby the range. Violation of these rules will be cause for removal from the property.
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
